## Adaptation Adventures

2 hours, Y4-Y5, \$8pp

Through a mix of animal encounters and observation, students will consider what unique adaptations our wildlife has to help them survive.

Students will gain an understanding of structural, behavioural, and physiological adaptations during wildlife encounters. A visit to our Wildlife Hospital as well as our Discovery Centre will be part of this adventure.



## Nocturnal Tour

2 hours, Y10-Y12, \$12pp

Meet some amazing critters and passionate wildlife carers on this after dark guided tour.

Learn about our unique wildlife, and Kanyana's endangered species breeding programs for bilbies and woylies. Find out how these programs are managed and how volunteers look after the daily needs of the animals.

Kanyana volunteers can bring Australian animals to your classroom/childcare facility.

If your class can't get away from the school, we can bring animals directly to you. Presentations range from 30-60 minutes (age dependent) and we can be at your facility for up to three hours.
